Marshall Fire Contributions



When a disaster strikes, Christians come together!

The Marshall fire raged through Louisville and Superior on December 30th last year, wiping out whole neighborhoods on its way. All in all, the 6000-acre fire destroyed or badly damaged over 1,000 homes and many businesses. The devastating fire was recorded as the most destructive fire in Colorado's history and declared a major disaster. Many neighboring towns, organizations, and churches pulled in resources to combat the fire and unite in the aftermath, providing shelter, comfort, food, and clothing to those affected.

Our church, Eternal Savior Lutheran Church, in Lafayette, Colorado, is within a fifteen-minute drive north-east from the fire, and the parishioners feared the worst. Eternal Savior was spared, and thankful. Soon after the fire, ESLC members collected over \$6,500 toward the needs of families we identified who experienced loss due to the fire. We were grateful for the generosity of Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Lakewood, Colorado and a member's family from out of state, who contributed significant funds toward this effort, as well as the kindness and generosity of our own members. The money was distributed among nine families, members and friends of ESLC, as well as the Sister Carmen Community Center, an active contributor to the Marshall Fire relief efforts.

Toward the end of March, the ESLC congregation was approached by Pastor Schlechte, our district president, with a request to identify even more individuals affected by the fire in view of additional funds the district had received. We gratefully accepted the challenge. In this effort, we approached several non-profit organizations already involved in helping people affected by the tragedy and devastation. The Sister Carmen Community Center, which has become a central go-to organization for the fire survivors, providing food, clothing, household items, shelter, rent assistance, and more, were given additional funds. We also identified "Hope Lives Here, Colorado," a non-profit whose mission is rebuilding bedrooms for children who lost their homes. To date, they've built over 70 bedrooms,

with more to come. We are blessed to be able to sponsor 8 bedrooms out of the funds received from the district. We also got in touch with the Marshall Fire Community Group, comprising close to 6,000 members, who helped us identify 34 families who were experiencing hardship paying for groceries and gas. Our \$150 gift cards were oftentimes received by survivors with tears in their eyes and stories that touched our hearts. Several grateful recipients noted they now were able to afford to celebrate Easter with their families.

Between the Rocky Mountain District contribution of \$42,266.32, and Eternal Savior and other Missouri Synod congregation cash and gift card contributions of \$7,057 – a total of \$49,323.32 in funds was provided to affected community members. The breakdown of funds distributed were as follows:

• Hope Lives Here Colorado, providing 8 bedrooms for children: \$16,000.00

Sister Carmen Community Center: \$13,223.32

• Twelve individual families (members and congregational friends): \$15,100.00

Marshall Fire Community Group (34 families) food and gas assistance: \$5,000.00

Reredos Committee

What is a reredos? It's an ornamental wall or screen behind the altar. When we built this church (already 15 years ago!) we had planned that at some point we would do something more with the wall behind the altar - the reredos. We do have some funding available for this project in the form of memorial funds specifically designated for this purpose.

The committee met on Thursday, May 19th to review the design suggestions that were received from the Liturgical Art Center at Concordia, Seward. They provided a design that included some muted colors of grays and blues to provide some contrast to the mountain profiles. It also included more pointy peaks that begin lower under the cross bar of the cross. The current design includes a pully system for banners so they can be hung higher. As we reviewed the design we have made other suggestions and are awaiting the next correspondence from The Art Center to move forward with implementation.

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) officially began work in the Dominican Republic in 2004. Over the years, a group home was established to care for orphaned children with disabilities; congregations and mission plants were started; and a deaconess-training program was launched. The LCMS seminary in Santiago, Dominican Republic, trains students from around the Latin America region.

- **5.** that God would grant strength to our deaconesses as they support the work of pastors by caring for the poor, the marginalized and the sick.
- **6.** with thanksgiving for all the faithful and generous people who have prayed or given of their time or treasures to make the seminary and mercy center a reality.

- **7.** for the seminary professors, that they would be well-prepared to impart wisdom and knowledge to their students.
- **8.** that the Spanish-language theological library at the seminary would be well used and a blessing to the students and faculty.
- **9.** for the families of the professors, that they would adapt easily and find joy in a new country and culture.
- **10.** for Lutheran congregations in Latin America, that they would be prepared to care for and support their pastors physically, mentally and spiritually.
- **11.** for seminary students who are serving vicarages, that they would learn much from their experience and be better prepared for their future ministry.
- **12.** for all the missionaries and leaders of the Dominican church, that they would discern God's

will so that they can build a firm foundation for the church for generations to come.

- **13.** that God would raise up individuals and congregations to support our LCMS missionaries in the Dominican Republic.
- **14.** that God would supply faithful and capable men and women to serve as missionaries, both in Latin America and around the world.
- **15.** with thanksgiving for faithful men and women who have given up the comforts of home and family to faithfully serve on the mission field.
- 16. that many in the Dominican Republic would hear God's Word and believe in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Pray that they would attend worship each Sunday to receive the Word and Sacraments.

- **17.** that God would grant health and safety to all missionaries and their families.
- **18.** that the Dominican Christians would continue to study God's Word and be strengthened to live faithfully and serve their neighbors in love.
- **19.** with thanksgiving for the willingness of the Dominican people to hear and learn God's Word. By God's grace, the LCMS has established congregations and mission stations around the country.
- 20. that God would raise up many Lutheran school teachers and school administrators especially from among the Dominican congregations to meet the needs of the large number of eager students.
- **21.** that the families of our Lutheran school children would also hear God's Word and be brought to faith.
- **22.** with thanksgiving for the large and ever-growing number of students seeking education in our Lutheran schools in the Dominican Republic.
- **23.** that the Lutheran mission churches in the Dominican


- Republic would continue to grow and mature through regular worship and Bible study.
