From the Intentional Interim Pastor August 2023

As I sit here in the office looking out the window writing my last newsletter article to you, I ponder what the future holds. For me, I do not know what lies ahead, maybe retirement, maybe another call, maybe another Intentional Interim opportunity, maybe a trip around the Great Lakes looking at the spectacular fall leaves, (*they are absolutely beautiful in mid-September*). I am really not sure what our gracious Lord has planned for me.

But when I think of Eternal Savior Lutheran church, I see a bright and vibrant future. It brings great joy to my heart. It is really exciting for me to see this congregation evolve and move forward, full speed ahead as it were, as it awaits the arrival of a new shepherd. My time here was indeed short, but it was truly enjoyable. The people of Eternal Savior are wonderful. You have been a joy and a pleasure to serve, and it has been an honor and a privilege to be a part of this fantastic congregation. I envy the next pastor because the people here truly remarkable. You are saints, and I will miss this congregation, for you have refreshed and renewed my heart for ministry. And I thank you for that! Nonetheless, as we continue in the last phase of our journey together, there are some things I want to reiterate for a successful transition.

First and foremost, never forget your Identity: Remember who you are: A baptized and forgiven child of God who are gathered together in unity for service to the Lord. Continue to be a volunteer and to be active in all the church's activities as many of you already are.

Secondly, always look ahead, never dwell on the past or how things were once done. Please be considerate to your next pastor just as you have been to me. It will make his job and effort a lot easier and enjoyable if he does not have to deal with that. It is a burden to the pastor's ministry.

Thirdly, keep your eye on the ball as you continue to move into the promised land. Keep your hearts and your minds on things that are above and that is Christ. Please, do not dwell on things below, which causes confrontation. For example, do not leave a note, in the mailbox, suggesting we are using too much paper for the bulletin because everything is already printed in the hymnal. The reason it was printed out is because 1.) pastor's prerogative to do so, and 2.) printing it out makes it easier for people to follow the service rather than constantly page through the hymnal. My point is this; be supportive of the ministry and be open to new ideas and different ways of doing things. Continue to attract younger families and increase the body's fellowship.

Fourthly, love one another just as Christ loves you. Always show love and kindness to your neighbor, and especially to your new pastor and his ministry. Remember to keep a good connection and positive attitude with the synod and the district as you work together for the glory of God in promoting His kingdom.

Fifthly, be in the Word. Read your bible and say your prayers daily. Continue to confess with your mouth Jesus is Lord. Please continue to attend Bible Class regularly and participate in other opportunities to learn the teachings of the Lord.

Finally, commit yourselves to the new pastor and the support of his ministry by giving your time, talents, and treasures. Pray for the new pastor daily so that His work among you will be a blessing to him and a joy, as it was for me.

Transition team please keep the focus and complete your given tasks before the pastor arrives. Assist him in his move and be eager to assist him with anything as he arrives. The goal is to make the transition easy for him, his family, and the congregation. I ask of the transition team to stay focused and together for ninety days after he arrives and to work with the new pastor until he is comfortably and firmly settled into his new position. Please steer the ship.

Define Your Life by How You Give

Winston Churchill reportedly said that "we make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give." According to Churchill, our lives are defined not by what we have gotten, but by what we give away. If you think about that. It is so true! Our Lord's life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God's Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. He died the death that we deserved for our sins. He gave of Himself in order to save us from sin, death, and hell. And so it is that by giving completely of Himself, He got for Himself us, making us citizens of His eternal kingdom by grace.

As it was for Jesus, so it also is for us. We get more from giving than we do from simply getting. For giving softens our hearts and frees us from the grip which the worries of this world and making a living has on us. For when we are singularly focused on making a living, we are singularly focused on what we get. That mindset begins to bleed into all areas of our lives — our relationships with friends and family, with neighbors and coworkers, and with the Lord. It shifts our focus from asking the question, "How can I be a friend, family member, neighbor and servant to others," to asking the question, "What have they done for me lately?" We become more selfish instead of selfless. But when we give, we do not have less, we do not become less; rather, we have more and become more. When we give, we join in the bond of friendship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus, we are participating in the divine nature. As Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

Update on the Progress of the Pastoral Call Committee:

Having started with the profiles of twenty-five (25) possible pastoral candidates presented to us by the District President, including five (5) candidates that were nominated by members of the congregation, the members of the Pastoral Call Committee have now pared this number down to the five (5) candidates which we feel are most qualified and best reflect the present and future needs of ESLC.

Last week we completed interviews with three (3) of the remaining candidates and have the remaining two (2) candidates scheduled for interviews to be concluded by the end of July. We are very happy with the quality of the candidates we have interviewed thus far; the final choices will not be easily made! Following the last interview, the Call Committee will again meet and pare the number down to three (3) final candidates, which will be presented to the Voter's Assembly for the final choice of candidate to receive our Call.

I have been in contact with Pastor Besel, our Circuit Visitor, who would like to conduct a **Call Service for ESLC on August 27**th **at 1pm**. This service will include the presentation of the final candidates and the vote for our choice of whom to Call as our next Pastor. We ask that the congregation keep the Call Committee and all of the potential candidates in your prayers and please remember that the Lord already knows whom he has chosen to lead us; we just need to figure out His will.

We continue to support EFAA with our monthly donations.



CHURCH WORKERS — AUGUST 1-15

Pastors; deaconesses; Lutheran school teachers; directors of Christian education, Christian outreach and family life ministry; parish musicians. The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) is blessed with many faithful church workers who assist and lead people in participating in the fulfillment of the Great Commission, while building up the Body of Christ.

Remember God's work through the Synod's church workers as you pray:

- **1.** with thanksgiving for the many dedicated church workers in the LCMS, who share in our joys and sorrows. Ask the Lord to comfort and defend them from every assault of the devil.
- **2.** for the Synod's pastors, that they would hold fast to the Word of God and find strength to continue preaching God's truth in an increasingly anti-Christian culture.
- **3.** for the Synod's deaconesses. Pray that they would be equipped with all things needful to love and serve people in every situation.

- 4. that God would bless the work of directors of Christian education, as they develop educational ministries for children, youth, adults and families.
- **5.** for the Synod's directors of Christian outreach, that God would guide their efforts to support a congregation's or organization's outreach and evangelism work.
- **6.** for directors of family life ministry. Ask that God would guide their vital work to strengthen the families in our congregations.
- **7.** for teachers and administrators in Lutheran schools, that they would model Christ-like behavior

for students and incorporate the Gospel message into each and every day.

- **8.** for directors of parish music, that they would find joy and satisfaction in their work of enhancing the worship life of the church.
- **9.** for the Synod's commissioned lay ministers, who work under a pastor's guidance to support a church's efforts in evangelism, Christian education, parish administration and other areas that are God-pleasing.
- **10.** for missionaries, who leave home and family to work in faraway lands. Ask God to give them strength, wisdom and protection as they do His work.
- **11.** for those involved in Specialized Pastoral Ministry, who serve the ill, imprisoned, aging, troubled and isolated. Give thanks for their service to people in the midst of tragedy or crisis.

- **12.** for military chaplains, who put themselves in harm's way to minister to members of our armed forces. Ask God to keep them safe as they share Christ's love with our servicemen and women.
- **13.** for the health and well-being of all church workers, that they would utilize opportunities for rest and renewal.
- 14. with thanksgiving for every person who volunteers in a congregation as an elder, an usher, a Sunday school teacher or in another capacity. Praise God that He calls His people to support full-time church workers in a variety of ways.
- **15.** with thankful hearts for the blessings God gives to His people through full-time church workers. These faithful men and women care for us, pray for us and teach us the Word of God.

AUGUST Pray For Us Calendar

THE CHURCH — AUGUST 16-31

"The Church is the congregation of saints [Psalm 149:1] in which the Gospel is purely taught and the Sacraments are correctly administered. For the true unity of the Church it is enough to agree about the doctrine of the Gospel and the administration of the Sacraments" (Augsburg Confession VII).

Remember God's work through the Church as you pray:

- **16.** with thanksgiving to God for raising up voices in every age and generation as He continues to call people to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
- 17. that God would raise up in our own time faithful pastors and church workers who will preach Jesus Christ crucified and risen, for the edification of His people and for the sake of those not yet of the faith.
- **18.** with thanksgiving that God does His bidding through unworthy and unlikely people. Pray that He would keep us from thinking more highly of ourselves than we ought and keep us focused on the proclamation of the Gospel.
- **19.** that God would give us faith so that we may not fear in times of trouble nor fall away in times of prosperity.
- **20.** for the Holy Spirit and the wisdom that comes down from above to be given to us, so that

God's Word may not be bound but have free course and be preached to the joy and edification of Christ's holy people.

- **21.** that the Church would work together in God-pleasing unity and that their joint efforts would further God's kingdom.
- **22.** for Concordia Seminary, St. Louis; Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Ind.; and other institutions that prepare servants for the Church, that they would properly prepare men and women to serve God and His Church.
- **23.** with thanksgiving for every person and organization that supports the work of the Church. The prayers and financial support of God's people enable the Gospel to be shared at home and around the world.
- **24.** for young people, that the Lord would lead them to serve Him and bless His people.
- **25.** *for us,* that when we are tempted to focus on the things



of the world or on ourselves, God would direct our attention to His Word and will.

- **26.** with thanksgiving that God continues to strengthen us through His Word and Sacraments.
- **27.** with thankful hearts to God for sending His Son, Jesus Christ, to die on the cross and rise again so that we might have the forgiveness of sins and the promise of eternal life.
- **28.** that we would joyfully study the Sacred Scriptures as a light to our path and gratefully make







use of the Lutheran Confessions to help us understand and apply the Scriptures.

- **29.** with thanksgiving for shepherds in the Church's history and pastors today, whom God uses to guide His flock.
- **30.** that God would keep all Christians from being led astray by false teachings, and instead bring them to a deeper knowledge of Him.
- **31.** that we all would be given a trust in the saving Gospel and a great passion to spread its joy with others in our lives.
