### **Update from your Call Committee:**

Following our congregational potluck last Sunday (08/27/23), we held a Call Service to vote on a candidate to Call as our new Pastor. Pastor Besel, our Circuit Visitor, led the congregation in a preparatory Call service of explanation, prayer and hymn that he, himself, had written. Following this, the podium was turned over to our President for the Voter's Meeting. After calling the meeting to order, the President asked the Call Committee to speak. The Chair of the Call Committee then gave a brief accounting of how the final three (3) candidates were chosen to be put forward from the starting list of twenty-five (25) candidates given by District.

The first order of business was a vote to accept the slate of three (3) candidates as presented. The slate was accepted, a committee member then read a short biography for all three (3) of the chosen candidates and the floor was opened for questions. Many member questions were put forward and answered by the Call Committee members, including questions concerning 'alternative' Orders of Service, what the candidates had to say concerning the possibilities for youth ministry growth, and why the Call Committee did not make a recommendation to the congregation on their choice of candidate. It was a very lively discussion back-and-forth on many levels, even getting Pastor Besel involved in explaining the standards set by LCMS for worship – those parts that must be included.

The Call Committee was then asked directly which candidate/s they recommended, and they answered that Pastors Thorson and Mundinger were so close that even they could not decide. They were then polled as to why they would support each candidate and also why they would not support each candidate – what they liked and what they were leery of. After all questions had been answered, a motion to vote was presented and accepted. A secret, written ballot vote was taken and collected from all voters by the President. The President and the chair of the Call Committee retired to the Fireside Room to count and verify the vote against records. The written ballots were separated by candidate and counted, and the results given to the President, who then added the absentee ballots submitted to him, as per our Constitution. In the first and only vote, a majority of votes went to Pastor Thorson. The results of the vote were relayed to the voters and a motion to unanimously Call Pastor Thorson as our new Pastor was put forward. The motion was approved by voice vote, with no dissenting votes.

Following the vote, Pastor Besel and the Call Chair again went into the Fireside Room and contacted Pastor Thorson by cellphone to see if he was still willing to deliberate our Call; he was. This information was relayed to the congregation and the meeting was closed with a prayer from Pastor Besel imploring us to pray for the Pastor Elect and for the congregations he now serves.

After the Service, the Call paperwork was signed and delivered to the Church Secretary. Later that evening, the Call Packet was sent by email to the Pastor Elect, with another hardcopy sent by FedEx on Monday morning. The District Office was also informed of the Call being sent to the Pastor Elect.

Pastor Thorson verified receipt of the email on Monday morning and will now prayerfully consider our Call and respond with his answer. This usually takes 3-6 weeks, but can take longer. When he responds to me with his decision, I will inform both the congregation and the District. While we are waiting for his decision, please keep Pastor Thorson, his family, the congregations he now serves and our congregation in your prayers.

### **Worship Time Survey Results**

Dear Friends in the Savior –

Over the summer we conducted a survey to understand the interest within the congregation regarding moving our Sunday worship to a later time. We had a strong response to the survey with 69 members sharing their views. The data is summarized below. The congregation stated a strong preference (88%) toward maintaining our current Sunday schedule with worship at 9:00AM followed by Sunday School and Bible Class at 10:30AM. With this strong sentiment among our members, we will remain with our current schedule and consider this issue closed for now.

- Sunday School and Bible class before worship discourages fellowship time
- ULC has an evening service for those wishing a later time. Also, could bring back Thursday evening worship.
- Numerous "I don't see a need to change" comments.
- Favorable comments for change: "Any time is better than 9AM", "A change of service time is a wonderful idea.", "if anything, start earlier."

#### THE CREED — SEPTEMBER 1-15

We confess the three ecumenical Creeds, the Apostles', Nicene and Athanasian. We believe in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, one God, three persons. Luther's explanation of the Apostles' Creed in the Small Catechism teaches important truths about God as our creator, redeemer and sanctifier.

Rejoice in God's goodness in Christ as you pray:

- **1.** Thank God that He is our loving heavenly Father.
- 2. Thank God for His creation.
- **3.** Thank God for daily bread. Pray that all would be fed and clothed this day.
- **4.** Thank God for family. Pray that God would guide all families love each other with the love of God in Christ Jesus.
- **5.** Thank God for shelter. Pray for those who are without homes this day.
- **6.** Thank God for reason. Pray that learning and intellect

are always in service of God's Kingdom.

- **7.** Thank God for Jesus. He is our only Savior from sin, death and the power of the devil.
- **8.** Rejoice that Jesus is true man, that He can sympathize with our weaknesses.
- **9.** Rejoice that Jesus is true God, that our Savior is King of Kings and Lord of Lords.
- **10.** Repent of all your sins and trust that God forgives your sins through the blood of Jesus.
- **11.** Pray that God would empower you, by His Spirit, to live in righteousness, innocence and blessedness.

**12.** Thank God that He freely gives faith and salvation through His Spirit. Pray that all would hear the Word and be Baptized according to His will.

**13.** Thank God for the Holy Spirit. Pray that He would keep all in the true faith.

**14.** Thank God for the Church. Pray that she would remain faithful to her Savior.

**15.** Rejoice that God gives and sustains faith in the Holy Trinity. Rejoice that God is love.







## **SEPTEMBER** Pray For Us Calendar

#### OFFICE OF THE KEYS/CONFESSION — SEPTEMBER 16-30

Jesus gave the office of the keys to the Church through His Apostles. Confession has two parts. First that we confess our sins, and second that we receive the forgiveness of our sins.

Rejoice in the gifts of Confession and Absolution as you pray:

- **16.** That God would lead all sinners to repentance.
- **17.** Confess your sins before God. Trust that God forgives your sins through Christ Jesus.
- **18.** Thank God for your pastor and all pastors. Pray that God would grant them faith and strength in their Word and Sacrament ministry.
- **19.** Thank God for corporate confession and absolution each Sunday.
- **20.** Thank God for the opportunity for individual confession and absolution with your pastor.
- **21.** Thank God for the vocations He has given to you. Pray that you serve Him and your neighbor faithfully each day.
- **22.** Pray for all unbelievers, that they would repent and trust in Christ.

- **23.** Pray for all who are caught in unrepentant sin, that they would humbly confess their sins and receive holy Absolution.
- **24.** Pray for the Spirit to empower you to amend your sinful life, that all you think, say and do would please God.
- **25.** Thank God for the Church. Pray that the Church remain faithful to the preaching and teaching of God's Word and the administration of the Sacraments according to God's will.
- **26.** Pray for those who have stopped attending church. Ask God to provide someone to share Christ with them and bring them back.
- **27.** Pray for Christian parents, that they would model forgiveness and raise their children in the Christian faith.
- **28.** Pray for the strength to forgive people in your life. Ask God to give the faith necessary to forgive as He forgives.









**29.** Thank God that He always answers our confession with words of forgiveness and life.

**30.** Pray that Jesus would return quickly, that sin and death will soon be finally defeated, and God's people will dwell with Him forever.
