Cottage Talks

These Cottage talks are informal, but they serve a vital purpose for creating a 'road map' for the future of Eternal Savior Lutheran Church, and to aid us in the calling of the next pastor. Another major concern, that has come out of these 'Cottage Talks' which needs to be addressed is this: Some feel that the Intentional Interim and call process may take longer than what the IIP is contracted for. Friends, brothers and sisters in Christ, let's not worry about such things. Be assured that 'if need be' and if the congregation approves, I can and will stay a little longer *(if needed)*. We won't let you be vacant again *(this is the fear that people have)*. Let's get to work, let's stay focused by keeping on track, so that we can keep things moving forward, and as Saint Paul reminds us, strive with all of your being to reach the finish line. Intentional Taskforce Team (ITT)

As we smoothly transition from Phase 1 into Phase 2 of our endeavor, we might want to recall the comforting words from Holy Scripture: "For I know the plans I have for you", declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" (*Jeremiah 29:11*). With that in mind, we want to establish an Intentional Taskforce Team (*ITT*). Now, you may ask what is an Intentional Taskforce Team (*ITT*) and wonder what does this team do? In short, an Intentional Taskforce Team is a group of the best and faithful people of a congregation, assembled together, (*reflecting the congregation makeup*), which will in turn aid the Intentional Interim Pastor in Purpose and Goal. This team will aid the Intentional Interim Pastor in creating a new identity, building programs, mission, and context. From July 9 – 13, six youth and two adults from Eternal Savior joined roughly 20,000 LCMS teens and adults for the National LCMS Youth Gathering. The theme for the gathering was "In All Things" and centered around Colossians 1:15-20. Each day was started in a Bible study with 4,000 attendees where we studied the theme verse in depth. The convention center was host to games, crafts, LCMS ministry booths, and an area where you could visit one of the LCC comfort dogs. Each day ended with a mass event with all of the attendees in Minute Maid Park. During our free time, our group visited the beach, had dinner with the Marble family, and toured the NASA Space Center. The gathering concluded with a worship service. Listening to 20,000 people singing "This is the Feast" while accompanied by an orchestra and choir was quite an incredible experience.
