In the past we have had some years where we had excess funds left over. We then have had a discussion about the use of these excess funds. It does not appear that will be the case in 2023. However, we also paid all of our bills on time. In fact, we will wind up with a balance in the General Fund that will be within a few hundred dollars of where we started the year.
