THE ORIGIN OF THE COMMON TABLE PRAYER

With the help of Professor Robert Rosin from Concordia Seminary, in Saint Louis, Missouri, this is what I have been able to discover about the possible origins of "The Common Table Prayer."



We know that this prayer originated somewhere in Germany. This prayer was also known as "Komm, Herr Jesu, sei unser Gast". It was widely used in the homes and schools of German Lutherans and other Christians long before our Lutheran Church Missouri Synod ancestors brought it with them to this country and gave us it's English "Come, Lord Jesus, Be Our Guest" equivalent.

This prayer cannot and is not traceable to Dr. Martin Luther and this prayer probably originated shortly after the Protestant Reformation as part of the pietist movement in Moravia that was led by Count Zinzendorf. However, we can be certain he is not its author.

The Common Table Prayer, formerly known as Komm, Herr, Jesus, sei unser Gast has also been attributed with some proof to Johannes Habermann, a second-generation Wittenberg theologian, who authored a German prayer book widely used in Lutheran schools and beloved by the German pietists too. And a 1994 German "Evangelishes Gesangbuch" states as its source-Bruedergemine, London, 1753-which seems to confirm that it is of Moravian pietist origin.

I think it's a fabulous and mighty, good prayer. And I think we should all continue to use it thanking God for all His many blessings which He so generously bestows upon us. We should pass it on to future generations so that they too may give thanks to the Lord for all His blessings. What do you think?

October 2022 Circuit Forum - Rocky Flats Circuit By Keith Cowley

Circuit? I built one in 9th-Grade Science, but what does it have to do with the LCMS?


Our congregation is part of the Rocky Flats Circuit (RFC) within the Rocky Mountain District (RMD) of the LCMS. Within our Circuit, there are nine congregations, shown on the map below. They are:

- · Beautiful Savior, Broomfield
- · Christ Our Savior, Longmont
- Eternal Savior, Lafayette
- · Messiah, Longmont
- Mount Calvary, Fort Lupton

- · Mount Hope, Boulder
- · Mount Zion, Boulder
- · Risen Savior, Broomfield
- University Lutheran Chapel, Boulder

There are seventeen circuits within the RMD. Circuits exist within each Synodical district to provide a way for congregations in a geographic area to support each other in mission and ministry, and to support effective communication and outreach between the District office and the congregations of the District. Central to this is the Circuit Visitor role. One pastor within the Circuit is elected to serve in this role. He works closely with the District President and is the DP's official representative to congregations within the Circuit. Within our Rocky Flats Circuit, Pastor Keith Besel, Mt. Calvary, Fort Lupton is our Circuit Visitor.

The Circuit Forum is a periodic gathering of representatives from each Circuit congregation. There are two voting members of the Forum from each congregation: the pastor, and a lay delegate. For the purpose of representation at triennial Synodical Conventions (every 3 years), it is the circuit that selects and sends one pastoral and one lay delegate to represent the congregations in the circuit.

The primary agenda item for the meeting was the election of the Pastoral, lay, and alternate delegates to the 2023 Synodical Convention (July 29 – August 3 in Milwaukee), Four RFC congregations were in attendance:

Members of the Forum also brainstormed ideas for encouraging greater cross-circuit congregational interaction and support:

- Restart Elder Workshops (last one was just before the pandemic).
- Leadership forums, with focus on bringing together Circuit lay leaders (congregational officers, church workers: secretaries, organists, etc.).
- Promote fellowship: Talk of a circuit softball league!
- Common Interests, promote the RFC as a "family".
- Financial Peace University (Mt. Calvary has trained instructors).
- · Care and decision-making for aging loved ones.
