

The Reformation and Martin Luther's Seal

The world was changing. New scientific discoveries had opened pathways for understanding more about our complex universe. The ocean, once feared for its danger and depth, was tamed for travel and trade. Peasants and workers, laboring under harsh and relentless conditions, sought revolution. The bubonic plague had claimed the lives of about 75 million people from 1347 to 1351. It continued to reappear and panic European cities. Political alliances, long forged between pope and prince, fractured as power centers shifted. Gutenberg's press (1455), the first to use moveable type, transported ideas from one person to the next with swiftness and ease. As the medieval era collapsed into modern, changes seemed everywhere and limitless.

Yet even during these changing times one thing remained constant: our God, who grants forgiveness and grace to His people through Jesus Christ. Despite advances and transformations in science and society, politics and publication, God was working. He gave hope and life by His Spirit through Word and Sacraments. He bestowed comfort and joy in trying and often perilous situations. In changing times, His promises through His Son did not change, nor will they ever. They will never be altered, nor revoked. His Word pronounces us righteous through faith in His Son, Jesus Christ. He alone is our Life and our Peace. With hearty confidence and trust we can say with King David, "My times are in Your hands." (Psalm 31:15)



The most enduring symbol of the Lutheran Reformation is the seal that Luther himself designed to represent his theology. By the early 1520's, this seal begins to appear on the title page of Luther's works. Luther explained that the red heart with a black cross at the center should remind us that the righteous live by faith in the Crucified One. The heart rests in a white rose, to show that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace. The rose is white, not red, because white is the color of the heavenly spirits and angels. The white rose stands in a field of blue, the color of heaven, to show that joy in the spirit and in faith in this life is only the beginning of future heavenly joy. Surrounding the sky-blue field is a gold ring, to show that happiness and joy in heaven

has no end, but lasts forever, just as gold is the highest, most precious metal.

Update from the Call Committee:

As we continue to be in contact with Pastor Thorson, our Pastor Elect, the Call Committee and Church Council have been reviewing our Call offer and looking at ways that we can improve upon it.

We have found out what his present health insurance plan is and have been looking at ways to continue this plan if/when he accepts our Call to ESLC. We also did some more calculations on the costs of moving a family of six (6) from South Dakota to Colorado (we previously had used information from our IIP's move here) and found a significant gap. Therefore, we raised our relocation figure offered to cover this gap.

We have also found some prospects on interim housing available to them, until the pastor and his family can proceed with their purchase of a home here in Colorado. At this point, we had a meeting in which we discussed whether we should offer our help, as a congregation, with a potential down-payment on their new home. It was decided that we should offer a loan for this purpose (down payment, closing costs, etc.), at a set maximum, with the terms of the loan to be set between the parties if/when it is accepted. With the aforementioned offered, we hope to make the decision to come to ESLC a little easier, and thereby receive an acceptance of our Call. Please keep Pastor Thorson and his family in your prayers.




