


# **Attendance Graphs!**

# **Update on Stained-Glass Window**

The committee has learned a lot about doves while researching designs for the window.

As a reminder, the church was working on the reredos and having the mountain mural painted while Pastor Schultz was with us. We discussed that the mountain mural represented the beautiful creation by God, the Father. Our cross represents God, the Son and we discussed that a stained-glass image of a dove in the round window would represent God, the Holy Spirit. Our representation of the Holy Trinity would then be complete.

Pastor Schultz recommended that the dove should be descending and Pastor Thorson agrees. The descending dove is the best representation of the Holy Spirit in the Bible as described during the baptism of Jesus. Other doves that are not representing the Holy Spirit and not descending would be the peace dove and the dove that Noah released at the end of the flood.

While looking for images of descending doves online, we noticed images of doves that have their heads in a circle of color. Pastor Thorson explained that the circle of color denotes a halo of light. It is given only to God and the Saints (Mary included) in traditional Christian art, and it symbolizes holiness and purity. It can most certainly be considered for our window. It also denotes divine authority or blessing. For the Holy Spirit specifically shown as a dove, the halo can often encompass the whole bird or just the head.

The committee continues to pursue local stained-glass companies in the Denver area. We have plans to visit studios, learn more about the process, and view first hand examples of their work. The Scottish Stained Glass Company is in our price range including installation. They have quoted us a price of \$20,000, but would like a little cushion to work with. The committee hopes to reach \$23,000 - \$25,000 with our fund-raising effort. Thank you to all for the donations for the window. We are almost there.
