A WORD FROM PASTOR THORSON

After the Resolutions Fail

I'm not a big fan of resolutions. There is nothing particularly wrong with them and certainly nothing theologically wrong with them when done appropriately. So, if you make them that's fine. I personally don't think a (possibly spur-of-the-moment) declaration is exactly the right way of going about setting goals or determining the course of one's life. Even if it is well thought out for a long period of time, the peer pressure and hype of the moment of New Year's Eve and Day make the declarations challenging to stick to.

I'm more of the mindset that we should simply let our "yes" be yes and our "no" be no, and that we shouldn't make a big show of what we're going to do. Rather, we should just go do it. Besides all of this, several studies show that New Year's resolutions almost always fail. At some point or another, most people fail or quit on their resolutions before February starts. And of the percentage that remains only a dismal amount of them stick with their resolutions through the first quarter of the year.

But, consider Psalm 1. There we see a man who meditates on the unchanging, unerring teaching (often translated Law) of God. God's Word never fails. Certainly, make goals to improve yourself if you wish, but know that your ultimate success lies with Jesus who will never fail you; who will plant you as a tree next to living waters and give you forgiveness and eternity. Trust in the Lord Jesus and trust your plans to him and you will succeed. God bless you this wonderful New Year.




Attendance Graphs!

Stained Glass Window News


Just a reminder that the plan for the stained-glass window is to have a descending dove representing the Holy Spirit. The painted mountain scene on the Reredos represents creation and God the Father while the cross represents Jesus. Adding the dove will complete the Trinity in the altar area.

On December 20th, five members from the stained-glass window committee drove to Scottish Stained Glass Company in Centennial to meet with owner, Martin Faith. We spent over an hour touring the facility, walking around their work room, seeing artists refurbish windows, and viewing the beautiful, completed work. The company is currently repairing windows from 2 churches in Yuma County that were damaged by the May 2024 hail storm. Martin explained the process of refurbishing and making windows to get the desired end product. Martin shared with us the endless colors and textures of glass and talked about how the design process would flow. By the end of our time there, we all wanted to sign up to be interns in their shop.


Later that afternoon, Martin was able to stop by our church and view our window in person. Tom met us there and was able to answer Martin's questions. We talked about film covers for the window to protect the stained glass. Martin explained the importance and the pros and cons of having the film on the outside of the window vs the inside. We also looked at access to the window from the outside.


Next steps will include several price quotes with different film options and painting options on the glass. Hand painting the glass pieces and then firing them in a kiln is labor intensive and expensive. We hope to have hand painting kept to a minimum with some work done on the dove wings/feathers.

Below are pictures of our window access from the outside, Scottish Stained Glass Window workroom, some of their current projects and a small sample of the glass choices. The current balance of the window fund is \$22,504. We hope to raise \$25,000 for the project.
















REMINDERS
