Lint in my pocket, Lent on my heart.

As a pastor, I get included in all kinds of corny jokes. One of my favorites (hear the sarcasm there) is whenever I or one of my colleagues brings up Lent, some smart guy (I have never heard a woman make this joke) and often enough another pastor says, "Lint? Why are we talking about lint? I have some in my pocket if you need some." Cue the polite laughter and mandatory follow up belly button jokes. After those are done, we move on to the serious discussion of Lent.

As I sit here, the dichotomy of that joke and the somber season of Lent paired with one another strikes me as revealing of the Christian Life. Read Ecclesiastes 3. There we find that there is a place for everything under the sun. When we come to verses 12 and 13 we find that a gift from God is for us to *be happy* and to *do good*. We can eat, drink and find satisfaction in our toil, and this is a gift from God. If we were to stop reading Ecclesiastes and all of the rest of scripture, we might come away thinking like the Sadducees of old thought, that we receive our blessings here in this world because there is no afterlife.

IF that was the case lets break out the lint in our pockets and joke it up, so that we find a shred of happiness and peace in this life. But, I hope that you know scripture and the book of Ecclesiastes has more to tell us. The book goes on to tell us that without God all things are vanity. But, on the other side of that, with God all our toil, all our strife, all our suffering and all our mourning has meaning.

In Romans, Paul assures us that God works in all things for the good of those who love him. So even in our suffering, even in our sin, God is at work for our salvation, for justice and for righteousness even though we may not understand how. So as we go through Lent this year, know that it is okay to find fun ways to joke throughout the season, but it is also okay to confront those dark sins and those painful moments from our life. We can do both because God is with us, and He brings joy and healing in his wings for the bad times and blesses us with laughter and light hearts in other times. With him there is truly a time and a place for everything, and through it all he will work for your good. Knowing this, please feel free to bring a little lint in your pocket to Lent . . . But, tell the Elders about it not me. God bless.


April 9 – Pastor Dave Ahlman sermon "He Was Numbered Among the Transgressors"



Online Offerings	\$4,428




This weekly average (\$2,653) compares to our 2024 weekly budget needs of **\$5,018**.

Saturday, March 1



Stained-Glass News

During February the Church council voted to replace the 5.5' circular window. This will provide more protection for the stained-glass window and will be easier and less expensive to do now rather than replace once the stained-glass is in place. Scottish Stained Glass Company will also replace the round window on the same day they install the stained-glass window. Specifications for the window are: the glass is 3/16"; tempered on both sides so it's virtually unbreakable. It has a Cardinal 366 Low E coating so it will reflect 73% of the heat away from the stained glass which means we can put a slightly lighter film on the exterior and get the desired effect of removing 85%-90% of the heat from the stained-glass. We will need to rent a lift to move the window into place from the outside. Arrangements have been made with SunBelt Rentals for the lift rental.

We have received the first round of designs from Scottish Stained-Glass. The committee will meet on February 28th to discuss what we like, what we don't like and how to move forward. Our agreement with Scottish Stained-Glass allows for several rounds of designs. Thanks to all who have contributed to this effort. Our total now stands at \$23,474 with a goal of \$25,000.
